- Students pursuing a Bachelor's degree are encouraged to begin taking 3/4XXX level courses once they have met the prerequisites to do so.
- IMPACTS courses can be taken in any order and/or can be taken later to allow students to take major courses sooner.
- All students must complete Writing and Math IMPACTS requirements within the first 30 credit hours.
- A "C" or better grade is required in ENGL 1101 and ENGL 1102.
- · Check all courses for prerequisites to ensure eligibility to enroll.
- Minimum 120 hrs. required to complete a Baccalaureate degree.
- Minimum institutional GPA and overall GPA of 2.0 required for graduation. Specific majors and degrees may have higher GPA requirements for graduation.

Major Information

Notes Regarding the Core Curriculum:

It is not necessary to earn an Associates degree prior to enrolling in HSDA classes. but students enrolled in 3000/4000 level courses must be Bachelors degree-seeking students.

SOCI 1160 - Social Problems should be taken in the Core, if possible. It may be counted as a Global Course, or as a Field of Study elective. This course is a prerequisite for one of the earliest required classes HSDA majors take in the program.

MATH 1401 is recommended for HSDA majors. While it is not required, it is advisable for any student interested in pursuing eventual graduate studies.

Notes on HSDA Major Curriculum and Scheduling:

HSDA 2100, HSDA 2110, HSDA 2200 and HSDA 3110 should be completed before any other HSDA courses are attempted. They provide the foundation upon which the rest of the curriculum and the field experiences are built. Students are not required to take all of these courses in one semester, but they should be completed prior to moving on in the program.

HSDA major courses are only offered on the Gainesville campus. All major courses are offered every Fall and Spring semester. ***These classes ARE NOT offered in the summer.

HSDA majors are encouraged to take higher-numbered courses (HSDA 3180, HSDA 3190) closer to graduation, to have as much field experience as possible to apply to the course material.

HSDA 2100, and HSDA 2200 are offered only on Tuesday, and Thursdays during Fall semester and Online during Spring semester. HSDA 3110, and HSDA 3120 are offered only on Tuesday, and Thursdays during Spring semester and Online during Fall semester. All other HSDA courses are offered only on Tuesdays and Thursdays or Online, out of consideration for the required Field Practicum hours.

***To graduate in a timely fashion, plan on taking at least one summer term (usually a Field Placement and one or more electives).

Notes on Field Practicum & Seminar (Field Placement) Courses

HSDA 2200 serves as an introduction to Field Placement. It may require a minimal amount of service hours, depending on the instructor's plans for the course.

HSDA 3201, HSDA 4200, and HSDA 4201 must be taken in order, and may only be taken one at a time. These courses are offered every Fall, Spring, and Summer semester. Each course requires 150 hours of service in the field, to be planned in consultation with the Field Placement Coordinator. Most HSDA majors complete their hours on Mondays, Wednesdays, and/or Fridays (when HSDA classes do not meet).

*** HSDA majors are required to have a minimum 2.5 GPA in HSDA courses in order to undertake Field Placement.

*** HSDA majors are required to purchase Professional Liability Insurance prior to entering the field for Field Placement. Twelve months of coverage is approximately \$25.

HSDA Major or Minor Electives:
