*Mathematics (beyond Precalculus) and Science have to total a minimum of 30 credit hours. CSCI 3200 counts towards one hour of Mathematics.

The two Mathematics or Science electives have to contribute at least 7 credit hours.

They could be another lab-based Science (4 hours) plus a 3000-level Mathematics course (3 hours).

**General electives are included to bring the total number of hours to 120. Reserve hours are only needed if you have to stay full-time, or repeat a course.
