

## Chapter 5

### Scenario 3: Burglary Transcript

On July 3, 2015 at 7:00 p.m., you arrive at 421 Green Street and speak with the homeowner, Barry Griffin. Mr. Griffin tells you that when he got home from work at 6:00 p.m., he discovered that the back door had been forced open and a flat screen television set had been removed from the living room. He also tells you that the master bedroom had been ransacked and a .38 caliber revolver had been taken. Griffin tells you that he works at the Trust Company Bank and goes to work at 8:00 a.m. He tells you he lives alone at that address and has lived there for 3 years. He gives you the serial number of the television, which is 5763672W and says it was a Panasonic, 42-inch set. The value is estimated by Griffin as \$350.00. The .38 caliber revolver is a Smith & Wesson, model 60, serial number ABF7630 and is valued at \$325.00. You walk to the back of the house with Griffin and see that the back door appears to have been kicked in. You walk through the hall and Griffin shows you where the television had been mounted on the wall in the Living Room. You photograph the mounting bracket and cable wires that have appeared to have been cut. You look in the master bedroom and see clothing from the dresser and closet on the bed and floor. Griffin tells you the revolver was stored in the shelf in the closet. You photograph the condition of the master bedroom. You obtain an agency case number from Dispatch and provide it to Mr. Griffin and tell him that a detective will be in contact with him the next day.
